Born and raised in Tillamook, Oregon, James embarked on a life of adventure after an educational trip to Europe during his time at Reed College in Portland, Oregon. Encouraged by a professor and mentor, James pursued a future in international diplomacy. His journey began with the U.S. State Department, where he was appointed as the first full-time cryptographer at the Consulate General in Tripoli, Libya.

Over his distinguished career as a United States Foreign Service Officer, James served in six different countries across Europe and Africa, as well as two domestic posts in Washington, D.C. Following his retirement, he continued making an impact by teaching English as a second language for 26 years. Altogether, James has visited 66 countries and all seven continents!
