## **Resident Spotlight**

The Puppeteer: Highlighting the Magical Life of Paul Davis

Paul Davis was a talented man in so many ways. He loved art and performing. Paul was the Artistic Director of the Puppet Show Place in Boston. He was a Master Puppeteer dedicated to his craft who worked within the traditions of his craft to create a special kind of magic. Creating a performance was a year-long process for him and he did most of the steps from idea to opening night. He designed and crafted everything himself, including the personality of each puppet. He did have a helper for sewing the puppets' wardrobes.

Paul was a hand puppeteer who preferred one-handed puppeteering over being a marionettist (two-handed puppeteering). With a puppet on each hand, he could put on a show. Paul won five Citations of Excellence from UNIMA-USA, received the Puppeteers of America's President Award (2021), and the National Capital Puppetry Guild Lifetime Achievement Award. He is an Artist par Excellence of American Puppetry. The Ballard Institute and Museum has a display of many of his puppets.

Paul lived over the Puppet Show Place and had two workrooms as part of his residence where he planned productions, developed and built the storyline, the entire set, crafted all the puppets from design to 'coming to life'. Puppets were made and repaired in these unmagical workrooms. He molded puppet heads from clay, glazed and painted them and adorned them with finite details to highlight their character and role in the performance. He created scenery, scripts, sound effects and mechanisms for controlling each puppet. One of his performances was 'Aladdin and His Wonderful Lamp'. Across a tiny stage he moved forty slaves, leading forty camels, who were leading forty elephants carrying basins full of jewels. Not to mention the effort bringing the nine-member cast to life.

Paul was a resident of German Centre's 'Sally Matthews' neighborhood who came to us mid-2019 and lived with us until his passing on August 4, 2025. We are all completely saddened by his passing. Paul had two dear friends who were dedicated to him and his life and care here at German Centre. Our deepest sympathy goes to his close friends and caretakers. While living at German Centre Home, Paul enjoyed reading and the daily activities hosted here.
